### **VETERANS DAY (ARMISTICE DAY)**

"THE GREAT WAR", WWI, did not officially end until the Treaty of Versailles was signed on June 28th, 1919, but President Wilson proclaimed November 11, as the first commemoration of "Armistice Day", because that marked the official end to hostilities in Western Europe, which was November 11, 1918, the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month. The first celebration using the term Veterans Day, took place in Birmingham, Alabama in 1947. Raymond Weeks, a WWII veteran, organized a parade and celebration to honor all veterans. In 1954, U.S. Representative Ed-

ward Rees of Kansas proposed a bill to change Armistice Day to Veterans Day, to include all veterans of all wars, the bill passed and was signed by President Dwight D. Eisenhower, changing the name of the holiday from Armistice Day to Veterans Day. In 1971, the Uniform Holidays Bill changed Veterans Day to the 4<sup>th</sup> Monday in October, to give people a 3 day holiday, but in September of 1975 President Gerald Ford returned Veterans Day to November 11<sup>th</sup>, due to the historic and patriotic significance of the date.


# Exciting News!! We're Making GREAT PROGRESS and you can help!!!!
